**Synopsis**: At the end of World War II, most Nazi concentration camps were completely destroyed, and all evidence of their existence scraped from the ground. Treblinka was notorious for its cruelty, the number of people exterminated in the gas chambers and cremated in its ovens, and yet its existence was completely erased. Think of the horror these bricks witnessed and the innocent souls they now possess!

## Where Did the Bricks Go That Were Used to Construct the Gas Chambers and Ovens?

Bricks and other materials from the concentration camps were used for rebuilding Germany after the war. They were used in buildings, bridges, roads, and more. *Bricks* takes place in 1983 fifty years after Hitler was named Chancellor of Germany— at a small and isolated brick building in the German countryside used as a dance studio. Many strange happenings occur on the anniversary of Hitler's rise to power, leading to a battle between good and evil, and the dancers are caught in the crossfire. The ghosts of tortured souls haunt the bricks— some seeking revenge and all seeking justice— to fight against the Nazi soldiers raised from

the dead by the Totenkopfring.
